We have had a busy few weeks both on and off the water. Now, in late March, we are very quickly coming to the end of our racing season.

All the Lakefest events have finished with LMYC yachts competing in all events and doing quite well. New additions to Lakefest this year was the radio controlled yachts regatta racing out of LMYC and WASC. Although different designs are raced at each venue, they are similar in speed to allow close competition. Also, for the first time our Cruising Division held a Lakefest Cruise following the Heaven Can Wait fleet then stayed overnight at Rathmines, prior to attending the 'Bit for Boats' bonanza run by The Classic Boat Association.

Swansea Channel.

I am unable to provide any good news relating to when the channel will be dredged. The TfNSW project website is not giving any indication as to when dredging will commence. MIDO, the TfNSW office responsible for the dredging are not responding to my emails asking for updates. Our current State MP Yasmin Catley has made the promise that if Labour becomes the next Government, they will get the emergency dredging done as a matter of urgency.

Currently the main channel is only navigable by shallow draft vessels less than 0.9m. The alternative, Airforce, channel is around 1.8 m up to around 2.1m when the lake is at its fullest.

Marina

Work will start in the next few weeks on the next stage of the wave fence. Starting at the end of the new fence down the H/J jetty, there will be additional piles driven and new fence constructed. Our plan is for access along the jetty to be maintained although there will be some restrictions.

Election of Board

We are coming to the end of our current term. Shortly there will be a call for nominations. I am pleased that all current board members have indicated to me that they will run again for another term.

NEWCASTLE CRUISING YACHT CLUB SAILING ACADEMY IS COMING TO THE LAKE.

Lake Macquarie Yacht Club is pleased to host the Newcastle Cruising Yacht Club (NCYC) Sailing Academy from 3rd to 14th April.

Over 2 weeks the Academy Instructors will conduct a number of sail training opportunities on the beautiful waters of Belmont Bay. These Australian Sailing accredited courses and experiences are delivered by fully qualified keelboat instructors.

Participants will sail onboard one of the NCYC Force 24 keelboats with an instructor and up to three other participants (total crew of 5).



Opportunities on offer include:

Women's Sailing – 4 sessions (3-6 April)

This is similar to the Start Crewing course, however does not set out to complete the entire Start Crewing syllabus. Instead, there is a greater emphasis on mastering each item of the syllabus rather than rushing to complete the whole list. The other major difference is that it is only eligible to females to participate – which creates a supportive and social environment for women.

Discover Sailing Experience - 3rd, 4th, 5th, 6th, 11th, 12th 13th, 14th April This is a one off 3hr experience catering to newcomers keen to try sailing.

Youth Emerging Talent Clinic – 4 sessions (3-6 April 2023)

This opportunity is for local youth sailors to give them an opportunity to have fun, take out our fleet of keelboats while Instructors work with them to develop greater boat handling skills, teamwork and communication.

Start Crewing – 4 sessions (11-14 April 2023)

This is an adult learn to sail course that follows Australian Sailing's syllabus. Participants will receive an Australian Sailing Start Crewing certificate that will be accessible on their Australian Sailing online profile. This is the first step of the National Keelboat Pathway.

Participants are required to wear comfortable active clothing, a pair of enclosed shoes (like sandshoes), and bring a hat and sunscreen. Lifejackets are supplied for all participants.

HISTORY LOCKER 'Rival' - The first LMYC to win a Hobart!

As our collection of photos, news articles and memorabilia expands, we are noting a multitude of yachts that have played significant roles in the history of Lake Macquarie Yacht Club.

One such yacht is "RIVAL", an Alan Buchanan designed 37 ft Sloop, constructed by S L. J. & B. P. Steel & Sons at Speers Point, Lake Macquarie in 1960.

The yacht was originally jointly owned by Alby Burgin and Nelson Rundle, and according to the LMYC Register had the sail number M2 from 1960 to 1973.

Rivals most notable achievement was winning the 1961 Sydney to Hobart Ocean Race, with her crew of; Alby Burgin, Nelson Rundle, Noel Felton, Hans Freimuth, Jack Morgan and Albert Mitchell.

In consultation with Albert Mitchel, the Board of Lake Macquarie Yacht Club officially retired the sail number M2 in honour of RIVAL and her crew for being the first LMYC yacht to win this prestigious race.



In the February 2023 edition of 'Afloat' a letter to the Editor highlighted 'Rival' was out of the water in Northern NSW and in need of some 'tender loving care.'

After some enquiries by the club, we have been advised that 'Rival' has now been sold to an unknown buyer and will be rebuilt.
