A MESSAGE FROM THE COMMODORE

It is time to get my contribution together for the April Forecast and while thinking about what to write, I received an email from our CEO to advise that the Annual Reports are required for the AGM which reminds me of the importance of the reports. Communication! In all organisations I have been involved with, being for work or pleasure, there is one thing or issue common to all. Communication. Either too much or not enough. It is very difficult to get it right. And these days it must be in the right medium.

We are quickly closing in on the end of my second term as Commodore and as I also need to write the Annual Report I thought it a good time to communicate what we have achieved over the last year. LMYC has had a very successful year. In sailing, LMYC won the RK Robertson Memorial inter-club Shield, a LMYC yacht won the best overall performance and LMYC yachts came first in all but one division. LMYC yachts also won the Lakefest best overall trophy and the She-Sails Tri-series.

Financially we had record takings across all income streams and total revenue.

The Board put together a Strategic Plan and although we still have some way to go with the youth sailing pathway we are working towards it. We are working with the NCYC using their Sailing Academy and trying boats, not just here on the Lake but in Newcastle as well.

Stage two of the wave wall refurbishment is underway with the expectation that it will be completed within a few weeks from now.

The kitchen refurbishment is planned for a May start. This is the only section of the club that hasn't had the floor replaced. We will have limited kitchen facilities available from the café.

We are currently developing the plan and cost estimate for a new mast crane and work area capable of lifting masts from bigger yachts including Multihulls.

The She-Sails program for promoting sailing to women is working and gaining support with 8 new female sailing members joining our club during the last year, along with 56 new male sailing members. Those numbers do not include social members who have started their sailing journey.

Swansea Channel

Although the channel has still not been dredged, I have had many meetings with State and Local government representatives regarding this issue. I must admit it is very frustrating, but the current status is that the State Government has committed to dredging. It is the Federal government department that is holding the process up. They have made many claims as to when it will be dredged and excuses as to why it is delayed. The Federal Government promised S10m to LMCC to purchase a dredge, not to operate the dredge only but to purchase the dredge. It is State responsibility to carry out the dredging. In discussions with LMCC they are putting a plan together with the aim of using those funds to install a sand pumping system to transfer the dredged sand to Blacksmiths beach. As the sand is the biggest problem of the dredging project I am hopeful they can achieve this plan.

Club courtesy mooring

LMYC has recently installed a courtesy mooring for the use of boats on the LMYC register. It is located on the south side of Wangi peninsula. See below extract of chart for approximate position. It is a red commercial mooring.

Election time

As I mentioned earlier, it is time for the election of Directors.

All our current Board are standing again for their current positions. The Board are all working well together achieving the best outcomes for the club overall.

I endorse all the current Board members for Re-election.


BOAT OWNERS MEETING

HISTORY LOCKER - The Easter Regatta

Our History Locker article this month features a photograph of the skipper and crew of LMYC yacht "Simba" M4, after winning the ocean race from Sydney to Swansea that kicked off the start of the LMYC Easter Regatta 1960.

What an exciting place LMYC was for a teenager hanging about the yacht club in the 60's. Families looked forward to the influx of craft and crew from Sydney. To wander the jetty, admire the craft, chat with the visiting crew, or just to enjoy the food, the fun and entertainment that was laid on made the wind up to the sailing season a memorable occasion. To some it was the "highlight" of the season.

What became an Easter tradition began back around 1930 when the newly formed club forwarded an invitation to the members of Sydney Amateur Sailing Club to participate in a regatta on Lake Macquarie at Easter. Seven boats responded to the invitation. The race started from Double Bay at 7.30pm on the eve of Good Friday 1931, expecting to arrive off Swansea Heads the following morning around 8.30am. Yachts were offered pilotage and towing into the lake as most yachts did not have engines, to their mooring off the yacht club. Visitors were welcomed by members of the club when the ladies auxiliary greeted sailors with lunch boxes and refreshments. A programme of racing followed on the Saturday in conjunction with Toronto Sailing Club and the Royal Motor Yacht Club's carnival. What became known as "The Easter Regatta" over time put yacht racing on Lake Macquarie on a solid footing which the officials of the Lake Macquarie Yacht Club worked hard to attain.

The Easter Regatta attracted 27 yachts into the lake, as reported in the April edition of Forecast 1960. The highest number of visiting yachts to attend the series in its 50 year history. On Good Friday morning locals lined the banks of Swansea Channel to watch the parade of yachts being towed up the channel into the lake.

Sadly, due to a variety of reasons, one of which we still experience today, difficulty with accessibility into the lake, the Easter Regatta's popularity began to fade. This was reported in the 1977 April edition of Forecast. Despite the lack of numbers the following was reported of that 1977 race.

"What a race up from Sydney and Pittwater! 20-30 knots of westerly breeze all night brought the two fleets up by early morn. The Lake Macquarie fleet won the re-dedicated "Founder's Bowl" in the inaugural event from Pittwater". Author unknown.
