MARINA NEWS - MAST CRANE UPDATE

In Late 2022 the club developed a new 5-year strategic plan. One of the commitments was a focus on upgrading the mast crane. The club engaged with Royal Haskoning Engineers, Redfern Flinn and Hunter Wharf and Barge as our preferred contractors.

The design process of both the crane and platform was completed in late 2022.

Work began early in January on LMYC's upgraded Mast Crane.

4 pylons were driven to a depth in soil of 10.5 metres. Precast concrete head stocks are being manufactured at the Hunter Wharf and Barge site, Toronto. The peered foundation should be ready near the NW corner of the Marina by mid-February.

Following this, a 15m-high Mast Crane with a 5m reach will be installed by HWB and Redfern Flinn, the manufacturer. If all goes well, the skyline of the Marina will show a purpose built, state-of-the-art facility very soon.

60TH AUSTRALIAN FLYING FIFTEEN CHAMPIONSHIPS ROUND UP - JANUARY 2024

It is Saturday 6th January and 17 Flying Fifteens converge on LMYC from all mainland States and Territories for the Nationals. Consisting of an eclectic group of sailors including two women skippers, five women for'ard hands, three past National Champions and one entrant from GBR, the week ahead is sure to prove entertaining to say the least.

Sunday night, the official welcome to all entrants is held in the marquee with Commodore Geoff making all visitors very welcome for the week ahead.

With measuring, sail registration and weighing complete on Sunday, the Invitation Race is held on Monday 8/1 in a light NW breeze with typical shifts left and right. Following numerous lead changes Ashley Smith and Kim Thumpkin in **FFSake** (RQYS) come out on top with Chris Villa and Mark Holmes in **Up Ship Creek** (LMYC) second. It appears the curse of good performances in the Invitation Race has raised its ugly head yet again as later results will confirm. (See Overall results)

On Tuesday 9/1, Heats 1 & 2 are sailed in 10 knot easterlies on a clear Belmont Bay with the Rainey brothers in **Where The Bloody Hell Are You** from Gippsland Lakes YC posting a 1st and 2nd and all other competitors posting their first discards, much to their disgust.

Wednesday 10/1, Heat 3 & 4 and another day in paradise, light increasing easterlies, and perfect courses from Race Officer Ross and his efficient team set up for another great day on the water. Once again, the Rainey's post a 1st and 2nd with Lewis Davies and John Radnell sailing Freshwater from Davies Bay YC posting a 1st in Heat 4. It appears this will be a one-horse regatta but the fickle finger of fate is set to strike.

Thursday 11/1 rolls up with Heats 5, 6 & 7 to be sailed back-to-back in a good building easterly once again on a clear Belmont Bay. Stand up John Hassen and Kevin Griffiths in **Final Fifteen** from South of Perth YC who clean sheet the scoreboard with wins in all three heats. The Rainey's struggle a little in the front bunch with a 2nd, 4th and a 5th but are still able to retain the overall lead by 3pts with one discard but with a little problem when the two discards come into play on Friday. At the crane, all sailors enjoy the cold beers supplied whilst awaiting the crane exit after a long day on the water.

Friday 12/1 arrives with another easterly, best of the week, 12 to 15knts for Heats 8 & 9. It appears this will be a two-boat contest in both heats between John Hassen/Kevin Griffiths (SOPYC) and Craig and Ian Rainey (GLYC) for the Nationals Title. In heat 8, the racing is tight with Hassen 4th and Rainey 7th leaving Hassen in the overall lead. The winner of Heat 8 is Trevor Williams with his daughter, Anna, sailing **Ten Pound Note** from Gippsland Lakes Yacht Club.

Heat 9 starts in a good 12-15knt easterly with Hassen covering every move from the Rainey's on all legs of the course to finish with a 3rd and a 5th for the Rainey's. The winner of Heat 9 convincingly is Dave Tabb and Dave Bennett sailing **Ark** from Christie's Sailing Club SA.

After discards, the winner of the 60TH Australian Flying Fifteen National Title is **FINAL FIFTEEN** sailed by John Hassen and Kevin Griffiths from SOPYC, 2nd is **WHERE THE BLOODY HELL ARE YOU** sailed by Craig and Ian Rainey (GLYC) and 3rd is **ARK** sailed by Dave Tabb and Dave Bennett from CSC SA.

Friday night's presentation is a great night held in the marquee with a great food by Crusoe's and many refreshments consumed by all, whilst commiserating over what could have been and what we all should have done, but didn't, as usual.

Commodore Geoff presented a huge array of trophies to all deserved winners. A big thank you to all volunteers for giving up their time for the week, Simon and Jamie for spectator boats on Friday and LMYC and staff for their help in making this a great week for all the visitors to the event.

Happy New Year to all.

Saturday racing returned on Saturday 13 January after the Christmas break. The second part of the season is jampacked with Lakefest in January and February, the Wangi Australia Day Race, the annual Heaven Can Wait Regatta, the She Sails Tri Series and the conclusion of the LMYC series.

Racing will finish at the end of March as Easter is relatively early this year. In April there will be Sailfest Newcastle and Sail Port Stephens.

With Swansea Channel dredging completed this is a great opportunity for LMYC boats to venture north for the first time in many years.

We are now entering regatta season, and there are several regattas scheduled or completed over the summer –

- The Belmont 16s juniors have been invited to sail on LMYC boats in the Sailfest Twilight race on February 23. We will be looking for LMYC boats to take the junior sailors (details are in issue)

All accidents involving serious damage or personal injury are to be reported to RMS. Failure to do so may cause the Club's Aquatic License to be revoked.
