SETTING SAIL

AN UPDATE FROM SAILING COMMITTEE

With the 2023/24 season closing, the Sailing Committee is working hard on the upcoming 2024/25 season.

The Boat Owners, Skippers and Crew Survey was recently sent out and we had 65 responses, which is consistent with last year's survey. We have had a good cross-section of the club with responses from Skippers, Boat Owners and Crew from all Saturday Divisions, Wednesday and Friday Twilight.

The results of the survey will be shared more formally at a meeting planned for 6:00 pm on Tuesday 14 May at the club.

Please come along to hear what your fellow sailors have said and to provide your input in person. Some of the key issues canvassed in the survey are detailed below.

Overall, there was continued strong support from the sailors at LMYC and there were some particularly pleasing comments about the professional way racing is managed day to day at LMYC. There are also some great ideas and suggestions on how we can improve racing. In the survey we explored some areas that we wanted to understand better including -

- How many people would recommend LMYC to a sailing friend or colleague (Net Promoter Score)? This year's score was again very supportive of LMYC and came out higher at 57 versus 52 and 53 in previous years. Scores over 50 on the Net Promoter score are considered to be very good. Importantly, we have increased promoters (score 9 or 10) to 65% of the respondents and reduced the number of detractors (0-6) to 8%. The respondents who scored 7-8 also reduced slightly. While 8% of respondents who would not recommend LMYC to a colleague is still too high and ideally we would like this to be zero, we will continue to work hard to address the issues in a proactive and positive way.
- Why we have seen a drop off in fleets in the last few months? The major reason seams to be competing interests (other sports, families etc) and lack of suitable crew.
- With the Swansea Channel now dredged, what interest in there in offshore racing? There was sufficient interest to warrant further work on this, but several comments about the channel beginning to lose depth need to be investigated further to determine if offshore racing will be viable in 2024/25.
- What support is there for moving from four Divisions to two Divisions on Saturdays? The vote was split with just under 30% wanting to stay with four divisions, 28% supporting two divisions, 28% who didn't have a preference and 14% supporting three divisions. It is clear that there are different opinions and no clear majority support for either two or four divisions. However, there were several comments that Division 1 was too small and the spread of boat speed in Division 3 was too wide. Sailing Committee will consider all of the comments and make a decision that they feel is in the club's best interests overall.
- What is the support for the current mix of Interclub and club races? Similarly to previous years, there is strong support for sticking with the current mix of club and Interclub races.
- How are the initiatives to attract women to sailing going? We are slightly better than last year but there is still plenty to do. There were many great suggestions to follow up on.
- How are the initiatives to transition people from small boat to yacht racing going? We are about the same as last year but the clear message is we need to do better in this area. The club has recently advertised for a sailing manager, and this new role will be integral in developing pathways into yacht racing. There were many great suggestions to follow up on.

Thanks very much to everyone who has responded to the survey. We value your input and be assured the Sailing Committee does listen and wants to improve yacht racing at LMYC year on year.

FROM THE CEO DESK

CHANGES TO THE CONSTITUTION

At the club AGM to be held on Tuesday May 28th the Board will ask all voting members in attendance to pass 2 Special resolutions. Special resolutions require 75% of eligible members to vote YES to pass.

Notes to Members on First Special Resolution

The First Special Resolution proposes a series of amendments to the Club's Constitution to bring it into line with best practice and the requirements of the Corporations Act, Gaming Machines Act, Liquor Act and Registered Clubs Act.

Notes to members on Second Special Resolution

- 1. The Second Special Resolution proposes to amend the manner in which the election of the Board is conducted, with effect from and for the purposes of the election of the Board and Annual General Meeting to be held in 2025.
- 2. Currently, the election of the Board is conducted by way of postal ballot.
- 3. Conducting postal ballots is a very time consuming and expensive process for the Club.
- 4. Accordingly, the Second Special Resolution proposes to provide the Board with flexibility to determine the manner in which members will vote in board elections. In this regard, the Board can determine that members wishing to vote in the election of the Board must do so in person at the Club's premises or electronically.

A detailed overview will be sent to all eligible members along with the Club Financials and Flag Officers reports in the first week of May.
