COMMODORE'S MESSAGE

Car park repairs

Weather hindered the repairs to the car park for over a week. By the time this newsletter comes out the car park should be completely finished.

Aquatic Services Committee:

Tony Austin is LMYC's representative on the Aquatic Services Committee and has passed the following information onto me.

Channel dredging

There is about two weeks to go to finish this round of dredging. I also understand that they are concentrating on straightening out the dogleg area.

The 'Permanent' dredging program is on track. REF approval has been granted for 10 years but the funding will only cover 5 years. The equipment is being transported to the lake, and they hope to commission the dredge and sand distribution system in late July/early August. Once they have commissioned the system, they will commence dredging the channel with a goal of 60m wide and -3.5m AHD (equivalent to 3m depth).

The pipe from the dredge does not extend to the drop over so sand from there will be pumped onto Elizabeth Island. They plan to use a short-term supplementary sand pump so they can work on the shallow area off the Swansea boat ramp. The channel will be surveyed every 3 months. Once they have completed the main work the trigger point for renewed dredging will be a depth of less than 2.7m.

The dredge will be operated by MIDO and can be used elsewhere within NSW, but Swansea Channel will always have priority.

Belmont Jetty replacement is progressing well - official opening booked for 18 Jun 26. The sewage pumpout is a low maintenance peristaltic design similar to Trinity & Empire marinas

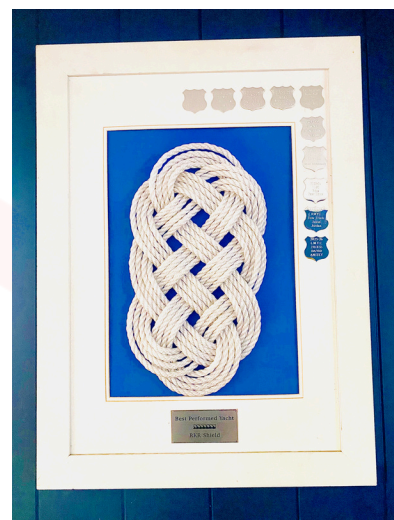

FIRE EXTINGUISHERS ON BOATS

Recently while at anchor in Blackwattle Bay near the Sydney Fish Markets, Waterways officers paid us a visit as we had swung outside the buoys that delineate the very tight anchoring area from the rowing area. Russell Cummings tells me he was told that from the Transport for NSW offices next to Sydney City Marine the Boating Safety Officers (BSOs) there have a direct line of sight along these buoys. That's something to be aware of if you ever go there.

While hunting us into the proper anchoring area the BSO did a safety equipment check. He was particularly interested in our fire extinguishers of which we have three, 1A:10B(E). He asked how much fuel we could carry, 220 litres I told him. To that he said we had the wrong extinguishers and we needed 1A:20(E) as we have over 25 litres of fuel capacity and because we are a bigger boat, we may need even more than 3 and/or larger. He said he discovered this while doing a Fire Fighting Course. He told me the TfNSW Maritime Regulations refer to the Australian Standard but don't quote the standard. He told me it will cost me \$183 to read it. I can't believe there are regulations that aren't open to the everyday punter to read so they can comply. To cut a long story short, I eventually discovered you can get access to Australian Standards for free in their Reading Room (online). One can read 3 Standards per year for 24 hours, no copying, sharing or printing. On reading the standard I found the standard only applies to boats carrying more than 25 litres of PETROL not diesel and so the extinguishers on 'Equinox' comply.

The TfNSW Boating Handbook is very sketchy about fire extinguishers. The actual regulation reads "Fire extinguishers carried must be of a type suitable for the type of fuel carried on board the vessel as specified in Australian Standard AS 1799.1-2009, Small craft-Part 1: General for power boats (as in force from time to time)". The rules vary in other states.

There is no difference in cost and they are the same size
Bunnings 2A:10B(E) \$19.00 AS 1799 recommends "2A" in each sleeping cabin
Total Tools 1A:20B(E) \$19.00
Sydney Tools 1A:20B(E) \$19.00

To bore you even more the numbering means:

1A equal to 1 gallon of water actually 1.25 US gallons for paper, wood etc fires (class A)
10B if used correctly able to fight 10 square feet of fuel fires (class B)
E suitable for electrical fires

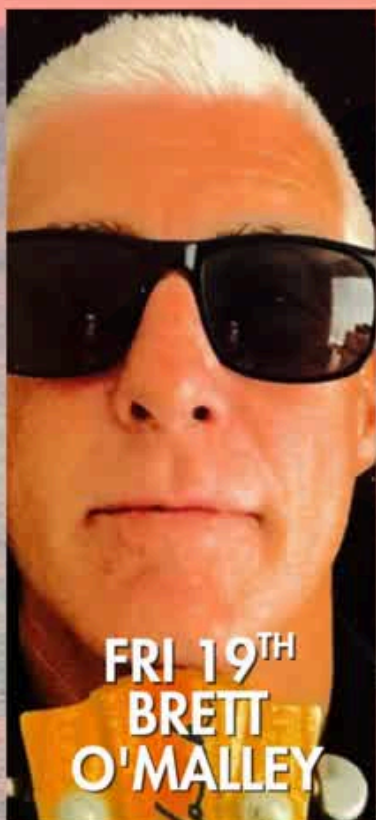



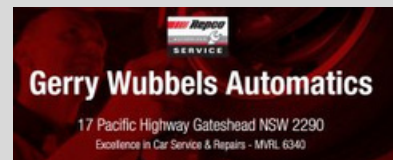
