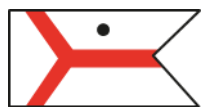

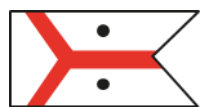

Saturday Pointscore Series

Saturday afternoon racing commences in the first week of September and concludes end of March. Other Pointscore Series may be added at the discretion of the Sailing Committee.

LMYC Offshore Pointscore

A number of offshore races are conducted between September and April generally to Pittwater, Newcastle and Port Stephens. They are daytime races to a destination on a Saturday and returning race on Sunday. A combined Offshore Pointscore Series is run in conjunction with Newcastle Cruising Yacht Club.

Wednesday Racing

Racing is conducted on Wednesday afternoons all year round and is for non-spinnaker boats. Both Sweepstake and Pointscore results are conducted. These races are generally handicap starts. Monthly "Scratch RCV Starts" on the first Wednesday of the month.

Friday Twilight Racing

Generally, in line with Daylight Saving Time, Twilight races are conducted late on Friday afternoons. Friday afternoon is a great way to try an evening of sailing with friends and family.

Lady Skipper Pointscore

The Friday Twilight series also includes a Pointscore for Lady Skippers on nominated races in the Friday Twilight Program.

Winter Series

During winter, starting in mid-May, Sunday racing is conducted over an 11 race series. A Sweepstake race is conducted for mixed fleet of non-spinnaker and spinnaker boats. A Pointscore series is conducted conjointly for all boats.

RISK WARNING STATEMENT

Lake Macquarie Yacht Club (LMYC) is a member of Australian Sailing (AS) and all Sailing Events are governed by the Racing Rules of Sailing (RRS) of World Sailing including the Prescriptions and Special Regulations (SR) of Australian Sailing, and Transport for NSW (TfNSW) including the Marine Safety Act 1998 and Marine Safety Regulation 2016. Further details of these may be found at <https://www.sailingresources.org.au/rules-hub>, <https://www.sailingresources.org.au/safety/specialregs> and <https://www.nsw.gov.au/driving-boating-and-transport/waterways-safety-and-rules/staying-safe/marine-safety-rules-and-regulations>.

Furthermore, the following Racing Rules of Sailing (RRS) are highlighted for each competitor:

RRS 1 SAFETY 1.1 Helping Those in Danger A boat, competitor or support person shall give all possible help to any person or vessel in danger.

RRS 3 DECISION TO RACE The responsibility for a boat's decision to participate in a race or to continue *racing* is hers alone.

RRS 46 PERSON IN CHARGE A boat shall have on board a person in charge designated by the member or organization that entered the boat. See rule 75. All persons on board a boat while racing shall be members of a Club affiliated to Australian Sailing and have an Australian Sailing number, or hold a valid Sail Pass, or if an international competitor, be a member of club affiliated to a World Sailing recognised Member National Authority.

Participants are advised that although LMYC is covered by third party liability insurance, this cover DOES NOT extend to participants. Each participating boat shall be insured with a valid third-party liability insurance with a minimum cover of \$10,000,000.00 per incident or the equivalent, which also includes coverage for racing.

Each PERSON IN CHARGE must be aware of the International Regulations for Preventing Collisions at Sea (COLREGS). These regulations apply in NSW and are modified through the Marine Safety Regulation 2016. Participant vessel operators are exempt from rule 12 of the COLREGS relating to the "give way" rules applicable to sailing vessels, but only insofar as between vessels taking part in the Sailing Event. The exemption from rule 12 does not apply if there is a risk of collision between a participant in the Sailing Event and a passing non-participant vessel.

By participating in LMYC Sailing Events each competitor agrees and acknowledges that sailing is a potentially dangerous activity with inherent risks. These risks include strong winds and rough seas, sudden changes in weather, failure of equipment, boat handling errors, poor seamanship by other boats, loss of balance on an unstable platform and fatigue resulting in increased risk of injury. Inherent in the sport of sailing is the risk of permanent, catastrophic injury or death by drowning, trauma, hypothermia or other causes. Each competitor expressly and unreservedly indemnifies Lake Macquarie Yacht Club (LMYC) and its governing bodies from all liability associated with these Sailing Events and releases LMYC and its governing bodies from any actions or proceedings of any nature that may be instituted in relation to these Sailing Events. Availing of the exemptions and conducting an activity under this RISK WARNING constitutes irrevocable acceptance of these conditions.

NOTICE OF RACE

1.0 INVITATION TO RACE

Lake Macquarie Yacht Club as the organising authority invites entries from owners of ballasted monohull yachts, multihulls and unballasted centre board yachts that are resistant to capsize, to enter the 2026–2027 Sailing Program on the terms and conditions set out in this booklet.

1.1 RULES

The Rules and Sailing Instructions (SIs) of Section 2.1 apply to all sections of these SIs unless changed by a Section.

1.2 2026-2027 SEASON RACING FEES

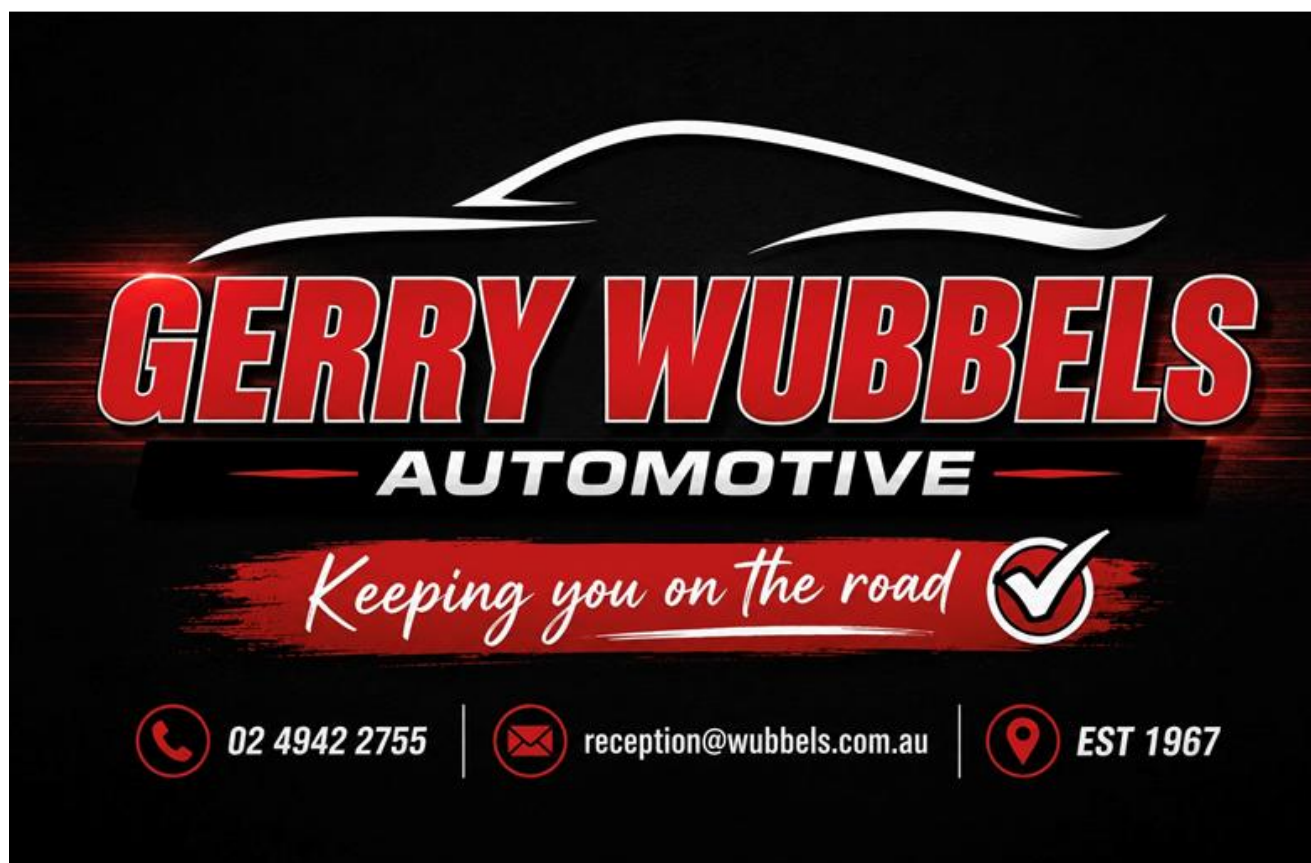
1.4 ENTRIES

1.4.1 SATURDAY RACING - Season Pointscore, Bay, Pursuit, Windward/Leeward, Pulbah, Offshore, R K Robertson and Other Invitation Series.

- 1.4.1.1 Entry for a Series requires completion of required information and payment of the prescribed fees by the entry system available at <https://lmyc.com.au/online-race-entries/>, and is to be completed and submitted online only. Series entries close Monday at 2400 hours prior to the commencement of the series being entered.
- 1.4.1.2 Late entries may be accepted after the first race in the series has been completed.
- 1.4.1.3 Entries for an individual race are to be submitted online by 1200 hours on the preceding Friday.
- 1.4.1.4 Late manual entries for an individual race will be accepted at the Club up to 1200 hours on race day. No late entry fees are payable however entrants may not be allocated a handicap and are not eligible for results or prizes.

1.4.2 WEDNESDAY, FRIDAY TWILIGHT AND SUNDAY WINTER SWEEPSTAKES / SERIES.

- 1.4.2.1 Series entry will be made on-line as advised by the Sailing Office prior to the first race.
- 1.4.2.2 Race entry is by payment of the prescribed fee at the LMYC bar and recording the boat's details including number of person's on board (POB) on the 'Sign on Sheet'. For Friday Twilight races, also record the boat's starting group and additionally for Saturday Sweepstakes and Sunday Winter races record whether the boat will sail Non-Spinnaker or Spinnaker.
- 1.4.2.3 Entries for races will be accepted by telephone to the Club Reception office no later than 30 minutes before the Start time of the first Division, providing the entry fee is paid, and 60 minutes if a scratch start.
- 1.4.2.4 Lady Skipper Pointscore; entry shall be made as per SI 1.4.1.1. (Entry for a Series).
- 1.4.2.5 Lady Skipper are automatic entries to sweepstake on night of Lady Skipper race.



SAILING INSTRUCTIONS & PROGRAM

Effective from 1st September 2026

2. GENERAL SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

2.1 RULES

- 2.1.1 All races shall be governed in accordance with the RISK WARNING STATEMENT on page 8.
- 2.1.2 When any boat races in its class fleet, it shall, in addition, be governed by its respective Class Association rules.
- 2.1.3 These SIs constitute the Sailing Instructions and the Notice of Race for the purposes of RRS 89 and 90.
- 2.1.4 For the purpose of RRS 89.1(c) LMYC is the “Organising Authority” and for RRS 90.1 the Sailing Committee of LMYC is the “Race Committee”. The Race Committee shall consist of:
PRO & one of the following
 - RO
 - Board Member
 - Sailing Committee member
- 2.1.5 Sunset shall be interpreted as defined on the Australian Bureau of Meteorology website “Sunset” in local time.
- 2.1.6 RRS Appendix A5.3 applies.
- 2.1.7 Offshore Racing Congress club (ORC) Rules and Regulations for scoring of boats with current ORC certificates.
- 2.1.8 All boats shall compete with a minimum of two people on board.

2.2 ACCEPTANCE OF THE RULES

- 2.2.1 Attention is drawn to the following rules;
RRS, Basic Principles, Sportsmanship and the rules, and
RRS 4 Acceptance of the rules.

2.3 SAFETY EQUIPMENT AND CONDITIONS

- 2.3.1 A boat competing in LMYC races shall satisfy the requirements of Category 7 of AS SR Part 1 and in addition shall carry;
 - A. A mobile telephone, and
 - B. A current copy of these SIs and
 - C. Details of the Current 3rd Party Insurance Policy in the sum of not less than \$10 million including coverage for racing.
 - D. A VHF radio of not less than 5 watts, switched on and tuned to Channel 71 and continually monitored for the duration of the race.
- 2.3.2 When the LMYC Race Control Box (RCB) is used for a start, all boats shall “Sign On” with the Race Committee (RC) via VHF Channel 71, a MINIMUM of five (5) minutes before its start time, confirming the Boat Name, Sail # and the number of persons on board (P.O.B.). The RC will repeat their recorded details for confirmation of “Sign On”.
- 2.3.3 When the LMYC Race Committee Vessel (RCV) is used for a start, a boat shall “Sign On” with the RC by either; complying with 2.3.2 above or by sailing past the stern of the RCV on starboard tack, and hailing the boat’s Sail number and persons on-board (POB), a MINIMUM of five (5) minutes before its start time. The RC will repeat their recorded details for confirmation of “Sign On”.
- 2.3.4 It is a boats responsibility to ensure that the RC has replied to confirm the boat name or sail number.
- 2.3.5 Non-compliance with one or the other “Sign On” method will result in a boat incurring a DPI and will be scored DNC. This changes RRS Appendix A5.

2.4 ELIGIBILITY TO RACE

BOAT

- 2.4.1 A boat shall have a current Equipment Audit Form (EAF) issued by an accredited Australian Sailing Equipment Auditor (CEA/NEA). All equipment shall remain current and on board as required by the EAF.
- 2.4.2 EAF's are obtained from the LMYC Reception Office or <https://www.lmyc.com.au/safety/> Bookings for an Audit shall be made at the Reception Office. Additional information can also be found at <https://www.sailingresources.org.au/safety/equipment-auditing>.
- 2.4.3 Spot inspections apply for equipment compliance per AS SR Part 1, regulation 2.02.2. The RC may protest a boat for non-compliance in previous completed races. (Changes RRS 61.3), AS SR Part 1, regulation 2.02.3 applies.

HELMSPERSON

- 2.4.4 The nominated Helmsperson shall comply with RRS 46 AS *Prescription*.

CREW

- 2.4.5 All persons on board shall comply with RRS 46 AS *Prescription*.

2.5 RACING EQUIPMENT & CONDITIONS GENERAL

- 2.5.1 A boat with movable underwater appendages on the centreline whether ballasted or not (e.g. a drop keel or un-ballasted centreboard) shall have such appendages in the maximum down position and locked in place whilst racing, except as provided in SI 2.5.2 and 2.5.7.
- 2.5.2 Drive shafts, power legs, water ballast, canting keels and canard foils may be moved. This Changes RRS 51.
- 2.5.3 A boat with water ballast shall have the designed maximum weight of water on board and shall not take on or discharge ballast water whilst racing.
- 2.5.4 A motor may be used to arrive at the start line after the boat's preparatory signal (i.e. 4-minute signal), provided that after ceasing use of the motor, and before starting and continuing to race, the boat completes a two turns penalty. A boat that does not comply with this SI will be scored DSQ by the RC without a hearing. This changes RRS 42.1, 44.2 and A5.
- 2.5.5 RRS 52 is changed to permit the use of electric halyard and sheet winches and powered canting keels.
- 2.5.6 Trapezes and adjustable wings enabling any crew member to position themselves outboard shall not be used in mixed fleet racing except where permitted by class rules.
- 2.5.7 A boat may use its motor or any other method of propulsion or lift its underwater appendages to get clear after grounding or collision with a vessel or object. The boat shall cease using its motor after getting clear and before continuing to race shall complete a two turns penalty. This changes RRS 44.2.

2.6 RACING EQUIPMENT & CONDITIONS - NON-SPINNAKER

- 2.6.1 **The following applies to all races designated non-spinnaker or where a boat notifies that it will race not using a spinnaker;**
 - a) Only 1 working headsail and 1 mainsail and 1 mizzen shall be set at any given time except when changing sails. This changes RRS 55.1.
 - b) The headsail shall be attached to a fixed forestay.
 - c) The headsail when poled out shall be by a pole attached to the main mast.
 - d) Fixed or retractable bow poles and outriggers shall not be used to set headsails; Refer RRS 55.3(a)
 - e) Retractable bow poles shall be retracted.
- 2.6.2 Refer to SI 2.8.3 for changes from non-spinnaker to spinnaker usage.

2.7 RACING EQUIPMENT & CONDITIONS - SPINNAKER

- 2.7.1 **The following applies to all races designated spinnaker races;**
 - a) Outriggers and fixed or retractable bow poles may be used only for the purpose of setting asymmetric spinnakers. This changes RRS 55.3.
 - b) Retractable bow poles shall be retracted when not in use.

2.8 ALLOCATION OF BOATS TO DIVISIONS & CLASSES

- 2.8.1 The RC shall allocate boats to racing Divisions and Classes and Groups which shall be displayed on the Notice Board prior to each race.
- 2.8.2 Classes and racing Divisions may be formed and disbanded, at the discretion of the RC. On disbandment, the RC shall make equitable arrangements for re-allocation of boats.
- 2.8.3 A boat which is allocated to a Division on the basis that it will not use a spinnaker and subsequently notifies that it will change to using a spinnaker may, at the discretion of the RC, be allocated to a different Division and/or be re-handicapped to reflect the change.

2.9 SAIL NUMBERS

- 2.9.1 A boat shall comply with RRS Appendix G – Identification of Sails.
- 2.9.2 The colour of sail numbers shall be a sharp contrast to the colour of the sail.
- 2.9.3 A boat whose sail number cannot be identified may be scored DNF. This changes RRS Appendix A5.3.
- 2.9.4 A boat may be protested under SI 2.9.1 where:
 - a) Prior written permission of the RC to use a substitute or trial sail has not been obtained.

2.10 SCHEDULE OF RACES

- 2.10.1 The schedule for the programmed races is as per [8. SAILING PROGRAM](#), which forms part of these instructions.

2.11 TIMES

- 2.11.1 All times stated in the program or these instructions, shall be read as Australian Eastern Daylight Time (AEDT) when daylight saving is in effect otherwise it shall be Australian Eastern Standard Time (AEST).

2.12 STARTING SIGNALS AND PROCEDURES

- 2.12.1 RRS 26 STARTING RACES shall apply to all races unless changed by these SIs.
- 2.12.2 When a handicap start applies, a boat's handicap start time shall be a number representing the number of minutes and seconds that a boat may start after the start signal is made. Note: When handicap starts apply, a boat's preparatory signal is deemed to be made four (4) minutes before the boat's starting time. Refer AS Prescription to RRS 26.
- 2.12.3 A boat, which starts more than 4 minutes before her start time, shall be scored DNC and shall not be entitled to a 'Recall Signal'. This changes RRS 29.1 and A5.
- 2.12.4 Starting signal, when a boat crosses the start line in the direction of the first mark within the four minutes before her allocated start time, the RC will make one sound signal at the time she crosses the line and may be notified by radio on VHF71 that she is OCS. This changes RRS 29.1.
- 2.12.5 When the "AP" flag is displayed prior to the warning signal of a Sweepstake race with a Clubhouse RCB start, the Warning Signal shall be displayed 10 minutes after "AP" is removed. This changes RRS Race Signals.
- 2.12.6 If the 'AP' is raised after the Warning Signal of such a race with a Clubhouse RCB start, the warning signal shall be displayed 1 minute after the removal of the 'AP'.

2.13 CLUBHOUSE RCB STARTS

- 2.13.1 To comply with RRS 30.1 I Flag Rule (if used), at the Clubhouse RCB start line, a boat may round either the yellow cylinder buoy which shall serve as the IDM on the eastern end of the start line or the Club mark on the western end of the start line.

2.14 BOATS NOT RACING TO KEEP CLEAR

- 2.14.1 Attention is drawn to RRS 23 that applies to boats that intend to race but are not yet racing and to boats that have been racing and are finished.
- 2.14.2 A boat infringes RRS 23.1 if it sails too close to the course side of the start line or the pre-start side of the start line or its extensions and interferes with a boat that is racing. The RO may issue a verbal warning. A boat failing to respond may be protested.

2.15 MARKS

- 2.15.1 Marks referred to in [9. COURSE SCHEDULE](#) of these SIs, shall be yellow cylinder buoy approximately 1100mm high and 300mm in diameter, with black vertical letters "LMYC". 'Pulbah' and 'Wangi Point' are the landforms so named.
- 2.15.2 For approximate location of Marks refer to [11. MARK DESCRIPTIONS](#) in these Instructions. A difference of a mark's GPS position shall not be grounds for Redress. This changes RRS 61.

2.16 STARTING AND FINISHING CONDITIONS

- 2.16.1 The RCV shall display an Orange flag signifying that the RCV is on station at the start line.
- 2.16.2 A boat may start after its start signal when the RCV is on station at the start line.
- 2.16.3 When an IDM has been laid, a boat shall leave the IDM on the same hand as the RCV or the RCB when starting or finishing.
- 2.16.4 In a handicap start race, except when a boat is starting (ref SI 2.12.2) or finishing, a boat shall not cross the start line from either the course side or the pre-start side of the start/finish line after the first Preparatory signal. A boat that does so shall have a DPI of two places applied without a hearing. This changes RRS Appendix A5.
- 2.16.5 A boat that has finished and cleared its finishing line shall not re-cross the finishing line in either direction. A boat, which does so, shall have a DPI of two places applied without a hearing. This changes RRS Appendix A5.



2.17 COURSES

- 2.17.1 Courses to be used and the order of rounding marks are described in the [9. COURSE SCHEDULE](#).
- 2.17.2 "P" indicates a mark to be rounded to port and "S" indicates a mark to be rounded to starboard. (PM) indicates a passing mark when a mark may be passed and it need not be rounded or looped.

2.18 RETIREMENTS / RACE DAY COMMUNICATIONS

- 2.18.1 A boat retiring before, during or after a race shall notify the RO of its intention to do so by calling the RO on mobile: 0414 450 022 or VHF71 at the earliest opportunity
- 2.18.2 Any boat retiring from a race and failing to advise the RO shall be scored DNC without a hearing. This changes RRS 63.1 and A5.3

2.19 PROHIBITED AREA

- 2.19.1 A boat whilst racing shall not pass between any permanent mooring, whether occupied or not, and the nearby shoreline.
- 2.19.2 Unoccupied permanent moorings are obstructions for the purpose of RRS 19.2 (a & b) and are prohibited areas. Boats moored to permanent moorings are continuing obstructions for the purpose of RRS 19.2(c).
- 2.19.3 A boat shall not come into contact with a permanent mooring or a boat moored on a permanent mooring. A boat that does so shall complete a one-turn penalty in compliance with RRS 44.2. This changes RRS 44.1.
- 2.19.4 All Cardinal navigation marks shall be passed on their safe waterside.
- 2.19.5 For the on-water safety of junior sailors, the Belmont 16's Club will raise a 900mm x 900mm pink flag on its race control vessel when their start and finish lines are in active operation. Any boat sailing through the active line will incur a DPI equal to 25% of starters without a hearing. This changes RRS 64.

2.20 HEARING REQUESTS

- 2.20.1 The protest time limit is 1 hour after the last boat finishes the last race of the day or the race committee signals no more racing today, whichever is later. This changes RRS 63.1.
- 2.20.2 Hearing request forms are available from LMYC Reception Office or on line at <https://www.lmyc.com.au/protests/>
- 2.20.3 Protests and Requests for Redress are to lodged at the LMYC Reception Office. If this is unattended then it may be lodged with a member of the RC or the RO.
- 2.20.4 RRS Appendix T Arbitration applies - an Arbitration meeting shall be held as soon as practical after the lodgement of a Hearing request form.
- 2.20.5 The posting of a notice of the lodgement of a Protest or Request for Redress on the LMYC web site or the Club Noticeboard within 30 minutes of the Protest time limit shall be notification to the parties, witnesses and competitors intending to be parties, in accordance with RRS 63.1.
- 2.20.6 Protests and Requests for Redress hearings will take place on the following Tuesday at 1830 hours in the LMYC Club House unless otherwise notified.

2.21 PENALTIES AND REDRESS APPLIED TO RACES RUN CONJOINTLY

- 2.21.1 In the event that a penalty or redress is applied to a boat as a result of its actions in a race, that same penalty or redress shall also be applied to any other event which may run conjointly. For example, all races: R.K. Robertson, LMYC Annual, Summer, Spring Pointscores, Bay, Pursuit, Windward/Leeward, Pulbah and Sweepstake.

2.22 HANDICAPS

- 2.22.1 The selection of the handicap method or adjustment system shall be at the discretion of the RC. The method or system of handicapping for each of the Club's Pointscore competitions and sub-series shall be displayed on the Club Notice Board and Website.
- 2.22.2 A boat's handicap shall either:
 - a) Be a number representing the number of minutes and seconds at which the boat may start after the starting signal of the handicap race and/or
 - b) An arbitrary TCF.

- 2.22.3 When using the TCF system, a boat's corrected time shall be calculated by multiplying its elapsed time by its TCF.
- 2.22.4 ORCc Time On Time ratings will apply for boats with current ORCc certificates.

2.23 ADJUSTMENTS APPLIED TO HANDICAPS

- 2.23.1 The RC, on advice from the Handicap Committee, may at its discretion apply an adjustment to a boat's TCF. Where an adjustment has been retrospectively applied to a completed race or is to be applied to a boat's TCF, her score shall be changed and the boat shall be promptly notified. This changes RRS A5.
- 2.23.2 A boat shall give written notice to the Race Committee three (3) days prior to a Saturday Pointscore race and not less than 2 hours before the warning signal of any other race of any of the following changes;
- Equipment**
- a) New sail of larger size added
 - b) Other sail variation
 - c) Increase of spinnaker pole length
 - d) Retractable, fixed bow poles, bowsprits or outriggers fitted
- Hull**
- e) Hull shape, underwater appendages, keel type or ballast changed
 - f) Propeller; 3 bladed fixed to 2 blade fixed
 3 bladed fixed to folding/feathering
 2 bladed fixed to folding/feathering
- Rig**
- g) Change of rig type or height
 - h) Change in rig or halyard configuration

2.24 ADJUSTMENTS TO HANDICAPS BASED ON PERFORMANCE

- 2.24.1 The RC, on advice from the Handicap Committee, may adjust the handicap of a boat if it is deemed to be in error, without a hearing. This changes RRS A5.
- 2.24.2 Details of the adjustments applied shall be posted on the Club Notice Board.

2.25 DECLARATIONS

- 2.25.1 When requested by the RC, a boat shall complete and lodge a written declaration in the form nominated by the RC on any aspect related to sailing under these SIs.

2.26 NUMBER OF RACES TO CONSTITUTE A SERIES

- 2.26.1 The number of races to constitute a series shall be 50% of the scheduled races rounded up except for the Annual Pointscore which will be 10 completed races.

2.27 CHANGES TO SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

- 2.27.1 For the purposes of RRS 90.2(c), changes to SI's, the required time unless otherwise stated is 2 hours prior to the warning signal of a race and 1800 hours on the preceding day for a change of a schedule of a race. Code flag 'L' will be displayed on the Notice Board, flag pole at entry to the Club, on the RCB flag pole at the South-west corner of the club marina and may be displayed on the RCV.
- 2.27.2 A change to the SI's will be posted on the Club notice board, may be placed on the Club's website under "Amendments and Notices", and code flag 'L' shall be displayed on the flag pole at the front of the Clubhouse and at the RCB and may be displayed on the RCV (if used).

2.28 SCORING AND RESULTS

- 2.28.1 Scoring and calculation of results are set out in the appropriate sections.
- 2.28.2 When a race has been started on a handicap start sequence and the course is shortened, the results shall be calculated using each boat's TCF handicap.
- 2.28.3 ORCc Rating Class results may be scored by the application of a boat's Time On Time rating printed on each boat's valid ORCc certificate for each relevant course, as sailed; being the All Purpose rating for Passage type courses and Windward / Leeward rating for Windward / Leeward type courses. The ratings shall be a multiplier of elapsed time, with the lowest corrected time being the winner and so forth.

2.29 PRIZES

- 2.29.1 Prizes for place getters in the Yacht and Class, Spring, Summer and Annual Pointscore Series will be awarded at the Annual Presentation Night along with 1st Placed Pointscore winners for Lady Skipper and Winter Sunday Series.
- 2.29.2 Prizes for place getters in other Pointscore Series will be awarded at the end of each series, at the discretion of the RC.
- 2.29.3 There will be no prizes for ORCc scoring results.
- 2.29.4 **Champion Lady Sailor - Ian Thorold Toll Memorial Trophy**
- 2.29.4.1 Written nominations are to be made to the LMYC Sailing Committee at least 6 weeks prior to the Annual Awards Presentation Night.
- 2.29.4.2 The nominator must be a full sailing member of LMYC
- 2.29.4.3 The nominee must be a full sailing member of LMYC
- 2.29.4.4 The nominee has shown to have been outstanding in in one or more of the following (in descending order of significance):
- SAILING PROFICIENCY*
 Has achieved win/s or podium position/s at National, State or local sailing titles
 Has competently participated in offshore races
 Has shown exemplary crewmanship & commitment in divisional sailing at LMYC
- SAILING MENTORSHIP AT LMYC*
 Has assisted and encouraged novice sailors at LMYC
- VOLUNTEERING*
 Has made a positive impact on the sport of sailing by regularly volunteering
 e.g. Sailability, Making Waves, Discover Sailing events etc
- SPORTSMANSHIP & LEADERSHIP*
 Within the Sailing Community
- PROMOTION & DEVELOPMENT*
 Contributions made for the promotion & development in the sport of Sailing within our community.
- 2.29.4.5 The winner of the award will be determined by the Sailing Committee with the presentation to be made on the Annual Awards Presentation Night.



3. SATURDAY POINTSCORE

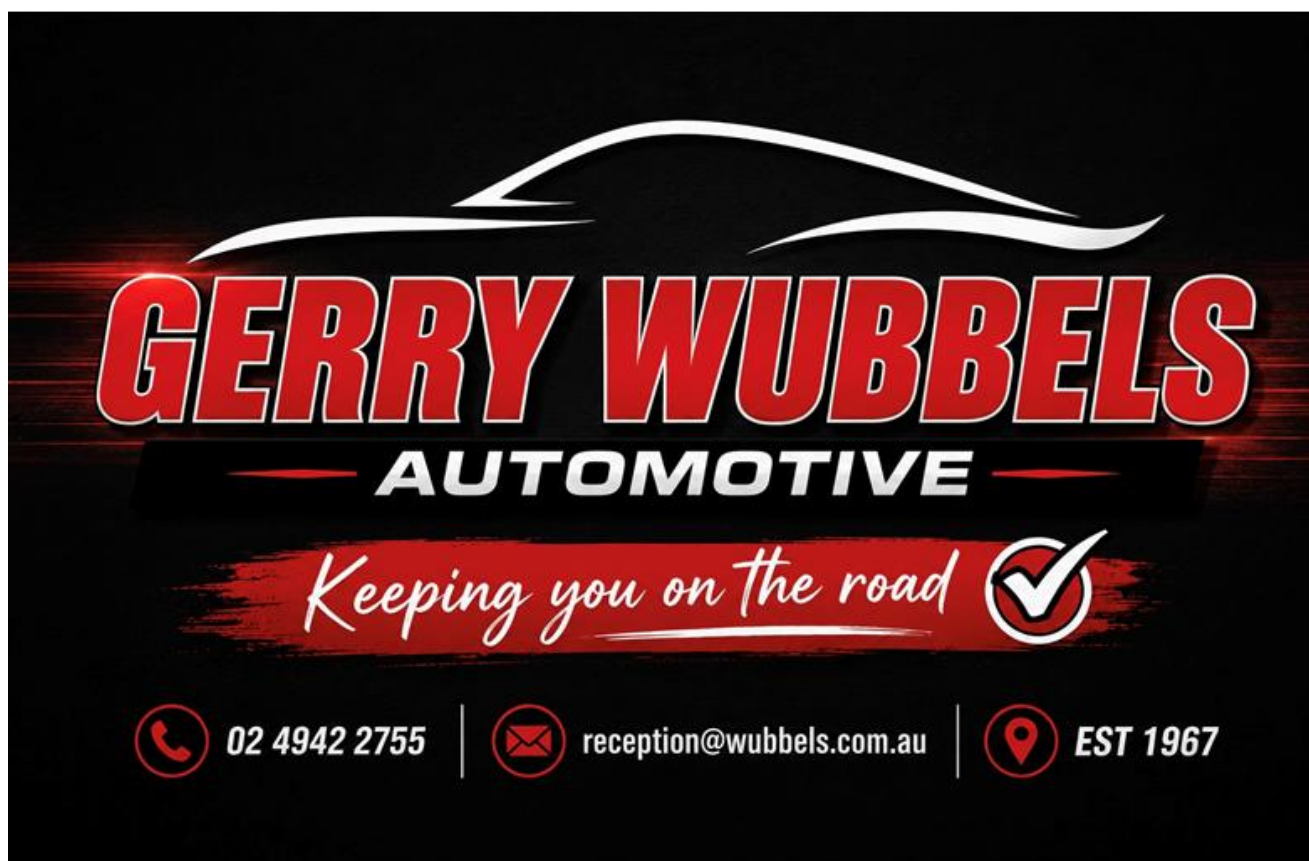
Annual, Spring, Summer, Bay, Pursuit, Pullbah Series.

3.1 TIME LIMIT

- 3.1.1 Saturday Pointscore races, each division, 4 hours elapsed time from the start of the Division.
- 3.1.2 Saturday Pursuit Series, 4 hours elapsed time from the start signal of all Divisions.
- 3.1.3 A boat not finishing within the time limit shall be scored DNF. This changes RRS 35 and A5.3.

3.2 SCORING

- 3.2.1 For Saturday Pointscore - The low point scoring system shall apply (refer RRS Appendix A4) except that A5.2 shall be replaced by A5.3
- 3.2.2 Where a LMYC Saturday Pointscore is run in conjunction with another series (such as RKR or Windward/Leeward) the corrected time shall be derived from the elapsed time of the LMYC boats multiplied by the allocated LMYC Saturday Pointscore Handicap.
- 3.2.3 The score of a boat entered as a casual entry in an individual Pointscore race shall be disregarded for Pointscore.
- 3.2.4 Results will be calculated using the TCF method. The lowest corrected time shall be scored first, the next lowest corrected time second, and so on per RRS Appendix A4.
- 3.2.5 For Saturday Pursuit races, boats will be scored in their finishing positions subject to penalties if any applied.
- 3.2.6 Average Points – Redress Given (RDG) may be granted to a boat by the Race Committee (RC) on application prior to it competing in an event sanctioned by the LMYC RC. Applications in writing must be received one month prior to the date of competition and be accompanied by proof of entry. The average points shall be the average of the boat's scores IN ALL RACES PRIOR to the event, rounded UP to the nearest PLACE.
 - 3.2.6.1 A maximum of two races per year may attract average points.
 - 3.2.6.2 Criteria for consent would be:
 - a. Class or rating category, sports boat or manufacturer's regattas, World, National, State Championships, other events approved by the RC.
 - b. Events of significant status (any Cat 1 or Cat 2 races (ie Sydney Hobart Yacht Race etc)



3.3 DISCARDS

The following discards being a boat's worst score will apply when calculating a Pointscore.

3.4 START/FINISH LINES

- 3.4.1 An RCV start line shall be an imaginary line between the mast on the RCV displaying an orange flag and a Dan Buoy mark displaying an orange flag.
- 3.4.2 An IDM displaying a red flag may be moored in the vicinity of the RCV and shall be left on the same hand as the RCV when starting.
- 3.4.3 The Clubhouse RCB finish line shall be an imaginary line between the red and white post of the Race Committee Box (RCB) on the south western end of the Club marina and the LMYC Club mark moored approximately 200 metres to the west of the RCB.
- 3.4.4 At the Clubhouse RCB start/finish line the LMYC Club Mark shall be a mark as described in SI 2.15. An IDM being a yellow cylinder buoy shall be moored near the eastern end of the Club House start/finish line and shall be left on the same hand as the RCB when starting/finishing.



3.5 STARTING PROCEDURES AND SIGNALS

3.5.1 Saturday Pointscore

The Warning signal will be displayed at 13:15 unless a "General Recall" or "AP" has occurred in a race scheduled prior to Division starts.

4.1 RULES

- 4.1.1 These races are NON SPINNAKER in accordance with SI 2.6

4.2 SCORING

- 4.2.1 For Pointscore, the low point scoring system shall apply (refer RRS Appendix A4) except that A5.2 shall be replaced by A5.3.
- 4.2.2 For Pursuit Sweepstake races, a boat will be scored in their finishing order, subject to penalties if any.
- 4.2.3 For all Wednesday Pointscore races, a boat scored DNC will score the number of starters + 10. This changes A5.3.
- 4.2.4 In the event that there are less than 5 paid entries 30 minutes prior to a Clubhouse RCB start or 1 hour prior to a RCV start, the race will be abandoned.
- 4.2.5 In the event there are less than a total of 5 starters per Division a result will be declared, points will be allocated to a Pointscore however Sweepstake prizes will not be awarded and handicaps not adjusted for the subsequent Sweepstake race.

4.3 HANDICAPS

- 4.3.1 Pointscore handicaps are adjusted in accordance with the method in SI 2.22.
- 4.3.2 Wednesday Pointscore TCF handicaps are independent of a boat's Sweepstake time handicap and TCF based thereon.
- 4.3.3 Where a boat wins a Sweepstake prize, (subject to the number of paid entries in each Division) its handicap start time shall be adjusted for the next race as follows:
 - i. 1st prize by adding 3 minutes;
 - ii. 2nd prize by adding 2 minutes;
 - iii. 3rd prize by adding 1 minute;
 - iv. 4th prize by adding 30 seconds;
 - v. 5th prize zero adjustment;
 - vi. All other boats not winning a Sweepstake prize as above by subtracting 30 seconds.

4.4 START LINE RCV

- 4.4.1 An RCV start line shall be an imaginary line between the mast on the RCV displaying an orange flag and a start mark displaying an orange flag.
- 4.4.2 An IDM displaying a Red flag may be moored in the vicinity of the RCV and shall be left on the same hand as the RCV when starting.

4.5 START/FINISH LINES CLUB HOUSE RCB

- 4.5.1 The start/finish line shall be an imaginary line between the Race Committee Box (RCB) on the south western end of the Club marina and an ODM moored approximately 200 metres to the west of the RCB.
- 4.5.2 The LMYC Club Mark shall be a yellow cylinder buoy approximately 1100mm high and 300mm in diameter, with black vertical letters "LMYC". An IDM being a yellow cylinder buoy shall be moored near the eastern end of the Club House start/finish line and shall be left on the same hand as the RCB when starting/finishing.

4.6 TIME LIMIT

- 4.6.1 Handicap starts - each Division, 3 hours and 30 minutes calculated as the elapsed time from the start time of the Division or Sunset, whichever comes first.
- 4.6.2 Scratch Starts - each Division, 3 hours from the start time of the Division or Sunset, whichever comes first.
- 4.6.3 A boat not finishing within the time limit shall be scored DNF as per RRS Appendix A5.3

4.7 DISCARDS

- 4.7.1 The following discards, being a boat's worst score, will apply when calculating the Pointscore.

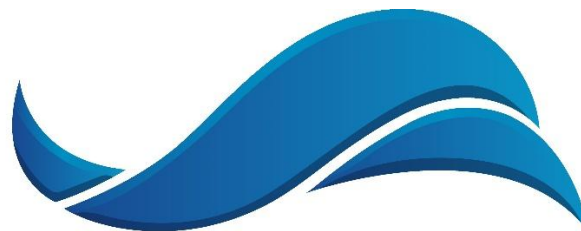

- 5.1.1 The races are NON SPINNAKER in accordance with SI 2.6.1

5.2 ENTRIES

- 5.2.1 **SWEEPSTAKE RACES** Refer to NOR 1.4.2
- 5.2.2 **LADY SKIPPER POINTSCORE** Entry for the Series shall be in accordance with NOR 1.4.1 – 1.4.2.
- 5.2.3 In the Lady Skipper Series, the helmsperson shall be female and steer the boat from its preparatory signal to the end of the race. Substitution of a male helmsperson is not permitted at any time, but a female substitution may be made.

5.3 SCORING

- 5.3.1 For Lady Skipper Pointsore, the low point scoring system shall apply (refer RRS Appendix A4) except that A5.2 shall be replaced by A5.3.
- 5.3.2 For the Sweepstake races, the results will be calculated using the TCF method. The lowest corrected time shall be scored first, the next lowest corrected time, second and so on as per RRS Appendix A4 and A5.3.
- 5.3.3 In the event that there are less than 5 paid entries 30 minutes prior to a Clubhouse RCB start the race will be abandoned.
- 5.3.4 In the event there are less than a total of 5 starters a result will be declared, points will be allocated to a Pointsore but Sweepstake prizes will not be awarded and handicaps not adjusted for the subsequent race.

5.4 HANDICAPS

- 5.4.1 Handicaps are adjusted in accordance with the method in SI 2.22 – 2.24.
- 5.4.2 Where a boat wins a Sweepstake prize its TCF shall be adjusted for the next race as follows:
1st prize by adding 3%
2nd prize by adding 2%
3rd prize by adding 1%
4th prize by adding 0.5%
5th prize zero adjustment
All other boats not winning a Sweepstake prize as above by subtracting 0.5%.
- 5.4.3 Handicaps in the Lady Skipper Pointsore are determined and adjusted by the RC and will be carried forward to the next Pointsore race without change based on performance in intervening Sweepstake races.

5.5 START / FINISH LINES

- 5.5.1 The Club House start/finish line shall be an imaginary line between the Race Committee Box (RCB) on the south western end of the Club marina and the LMYC Club Mark moored approximately 200 metres to the west of the RCB.
- 5.5.2 The LMYC Club Mark shall be a yellow cylinder buoy approximately 1100mm high and 300mm in diameter, with black vertical letters "LMYC". An inner distance LMYC Mark shall be a yellow cylinder buoy shall be moored near the eastern end of the Club House start/finish line and shall be left on the same hand as the RCB when starting/finishing.

5.6 TIME LIMIT

- 5.6.1 The time limit shall be 2 hours calculated as the elapsed time from the start time of Group A or Sunset, whichever comes first.
- 5.6.2 A boat not finishing within the time limit shall be scored DNF per RRS Appendix A5.3

5.7 DISCARDS

- 5.7.1 If six races are completed in the Lady skipper series, there will be one (1) drop.

5.8 PRIZES

- 5.8.1 Prizes shall be awarded to place getters in Sweepstake races as soon as possible after the race depending on the number of starters as follows;

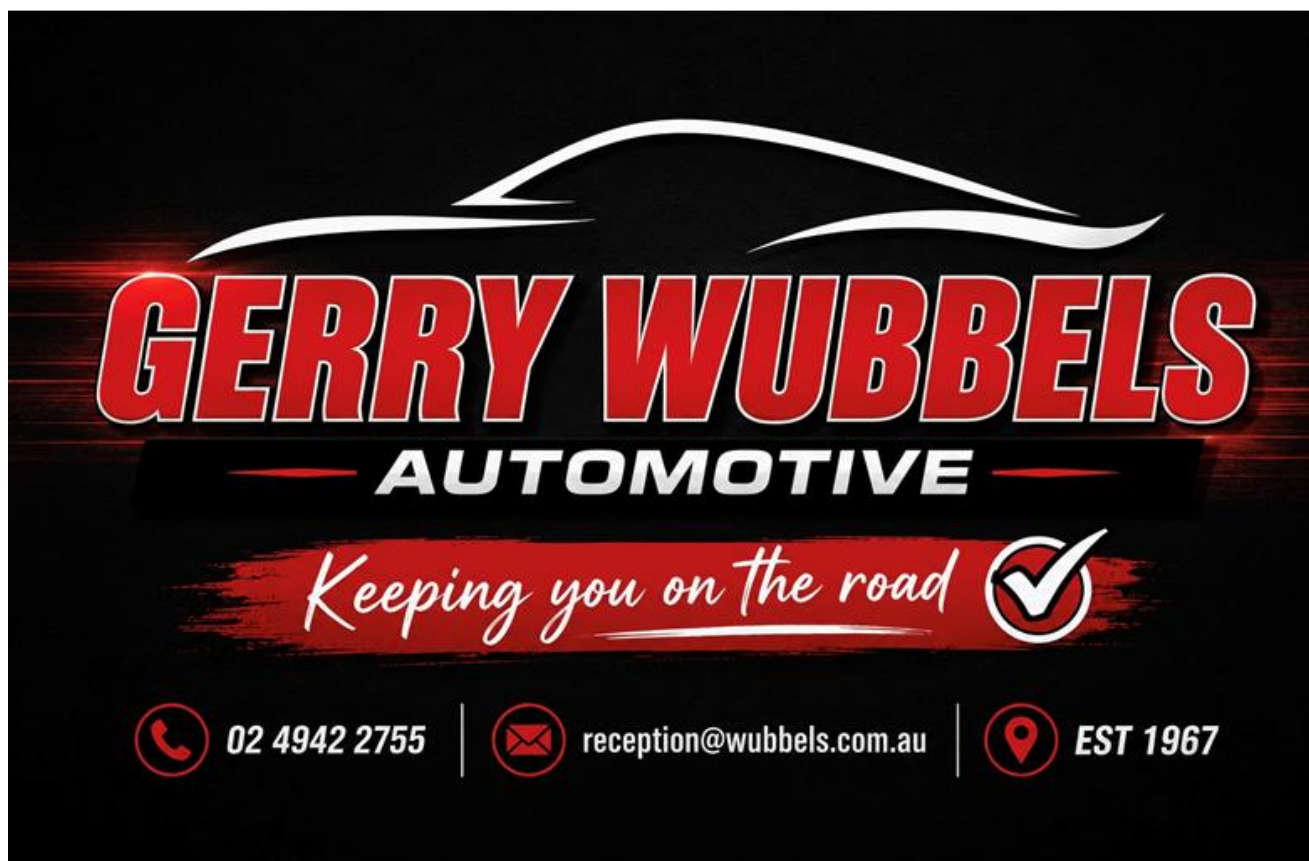

6.2 ENTRIES

- 6.2.1 SWEEPSTAKE RACES Refer to 1. NOTICE OF RACE, specifically 1.4.2. All entrants are automatic entries in the Pointscore series.

6.3 SCORING

- 6.3.1 For the Sweepstake and Pointscore, the results will be calculated using the TCF method. The fastest corrected time shall be scored first, the next fastest time, second and so on per RRS Appendix A4. RRS A5.2 shall be replaced by A5.3. A boat scored DNC will score the number of starters + 10. This changes RRS A5.3.
- 6.3.2 In the event that there are less than 5 paid entries 30 minutes prior to a Clubhouse RCB start, the race will be abandoned.
- 6.3.3 In the event there are less than a total of 5 starters a result will be declared, points will be allocated to a Pointscore but Sweepstake prizes will not be awarded and handicaps not adjusted for the subsequent race.

6.4 HANDICAPS

- 6.4.1 Pointscore handicaps are adjusted in accordance with the method in SI 2.22 – 2.24.
- 6.4.2 Where a boat wins a Sweepstake prize its TCF shall be adjusted for the next race as follows:
- 1st prize by adding 3%
 - 2nd prize by adding 2%
 - 3rd prize by adding 1%
 - 4th prize by adding 0.5%
 - 5th prize zero adjustment
- All other boats not winning a Sweepstake prize as above by subtracting 0.5%.

6.5 START / FINISH LINES

- 6.5.1 The Club House start/finish line shall be an imaginary line between the Race Committee Box (RCB) on the south western end of the Club marina and the LMYC Club Mark moored approximately 200 metres to the west of the RCB.
- 6.5.2 The LMYC Club Mark shall be a yellow cylinder buoy approximately 1100mm high and 300mm in diameter, with black vertical letters "LMYC". An IDM being a yellow cylinder buoy shall be moored near the eastern end of the Club House start/finish line and shall be left on the same hand as the RCB when starting/finishing.

6.6 TIME LIMIT

- 6.6.1 The time limit shall be 3 hours 30 minutes calculated as the elapsed time from the start time of Group A.
- 6.6.2 A boat not finishing within the time limit shall be scored DNF per RRS Appendix A5.3

6.8 DISCARDS

- 6.8.1 The following discards being a boat's worst score will apply when calculating a Pointscore.

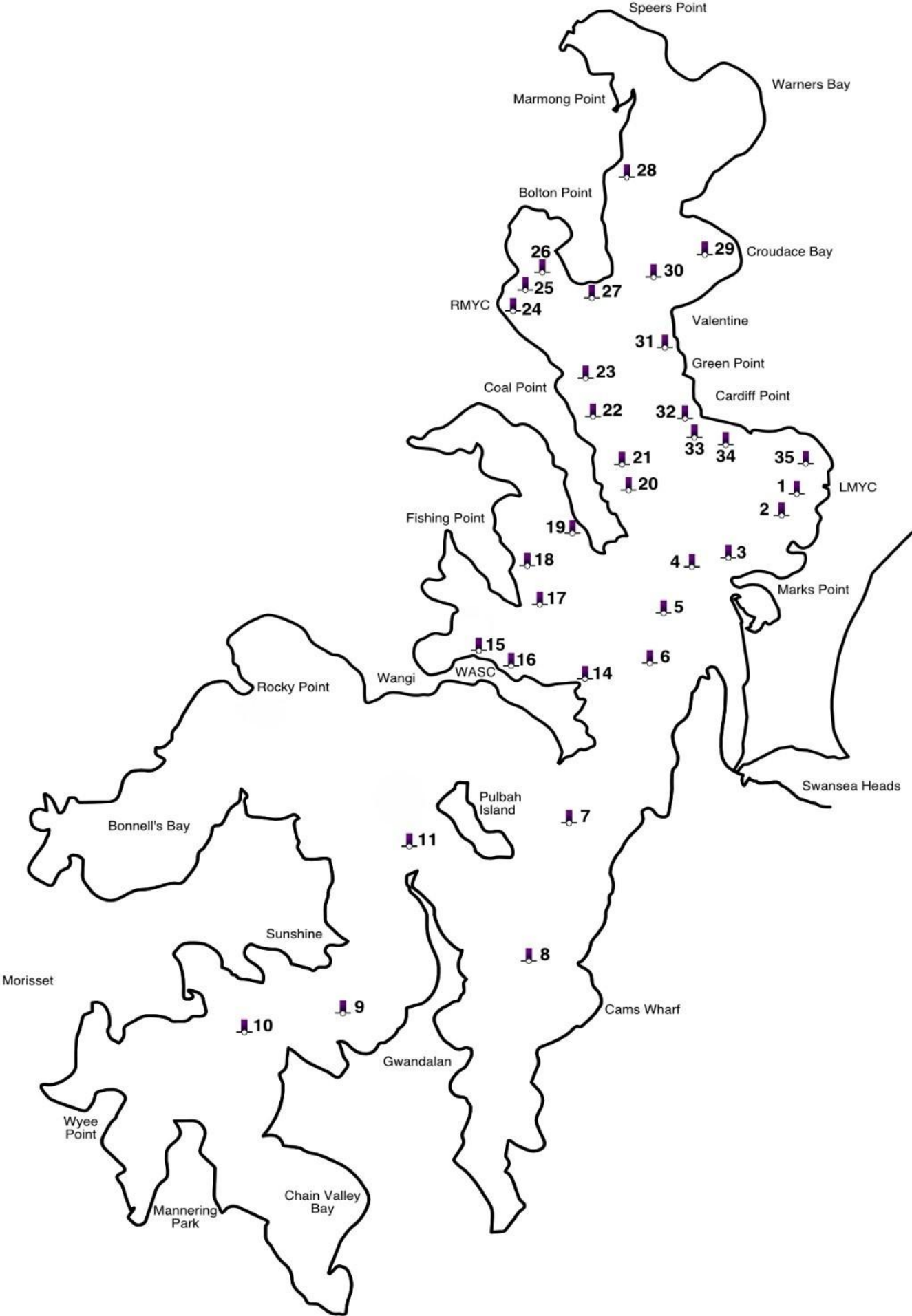

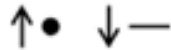

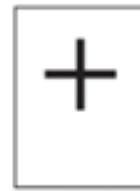
